Special Enrollment Period for Medicare Supplements

 In January 2020, insurance agents in Colorado and across the country are no longer able to sell Plans C, F and F+ to Medicare beneficiaries

- Colorado created a Special Enrollment Period for Medicare beneficiaries who have these plans can change to a Plan D, G or G+ (no G+ is available in Colorado)
- Special Enrollment ends June 30, 2021; can change to any plan with any company; no underwriting regardless of preexisting conditions.

Low Income Senior Dental Program

 Provides dental services to individuals who do not have dental insurance or Medicaid age 60 and over and whose income is less than 250% of poverty

- \$4 million dollars available July 1, 2021
- Individuals who have a Medicare Advantage plan with an embedded dental benefit are not eligible to receive dental care
- Dental Advisory Committee consumer rep position is open

Senior Homestead Property Tax Exemption

• Tax credit will be available on the first \$200,000 of value to homeowners who have lived in their homes for 10 years or more for 2022 for taxes owed in 2021

- If you know individuals who have lived in their home for 10 years and are age 65, have them apply at the county assessor's office prior to July 15
- Rep Chris Kennedy is planning to work on an initiative during the summer. Discussion is focusing on increasing equity in the tax credit.

LOW-INCOME ENERGY AND WATER ASSISTANCE COMMISSION IN THE COLORADO ENERGY OFFICE

 Commission to make policies about low income energy and water

SB21-175 Prescription Drug Affordability Review Board

- Creates a review board appointed by the Governor to establish the upper payment limit that a consumer would pay for prescriptions out of pocket
- Starting 1/1/22, no purchaser or payer can pay more than the upper limit; someone violates -\$1000 fine
- Manufacturers have to give 180 day notice to withdraw drugs
- Cannot consider the impact to older adults and persons with disabilities shall not place a lower value on their lives
- Medicare Prescription Drug Plans and Medicare Advantage Plans can opt-in to participate

- Division of Insurance in Department of Regulatory Agencies
- Starts 1/1/22

Sent to Governor

HB21-1264 Funds Workforce Development Increase Worker Skills

- Overall appropriation \$200,000,000 for jobs
- \$25 million for a State Council in cooperation with Dept of Labor to work on reskilling, upskilling, and nextskilling worker programs to facilitate training for unemployed and underemployed workers
 - \$20 million for work force development
 - \$10 million to higher ed and community organizations
 - \$1,250,000 for digital platforms, outreach and recruitment, and program implementation
- Funds will be available to many types of organizations
- Focus on well-paying jobs
- Funds can be used for: outreach, coaching, skills training, ESL, communities of color
- Funds must be obligated by 12/31/24 and spent by 12/31/26; repealed 7/1/27
- Stakeholder process

HB 21-1171 Kidney Disease Task Force

- Work with entities to create kidney disease educational programs to increase awareness
- Examine chronic kidney disease, transplantation, donation, and the higher rates of affliction in minority populations
- Develop a plan for awareness campaign that includes workshops, preventative screenings, social media campaigns, and television and radio commercials
- \$200,000 for a two year initiative

State Agency Responsible for Rules

- Public Health and Environment
- Committee must convene by November 1, 2021 at least four times.
- Repealed on 9/1/26.

Sent to the Governor

- Contact CPDHE to identify who is responsible for this initiative
- Work with health department officials on an effective campaign

HB21-1105 Concerning Utility Customers' Financial Contributions for Low-Income Utility Assistance

- ALL SNAP RECIPIENTS SHALL GET A LEAP PAYMENT
- Data matching between SNAP and LEAP and CBMS
- ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
 - Requires customers to pay \$1 for electric and \$1 for natural gas into the energy assistance fund; and voluntary support for water starting 10/1/21
 - Monthly Billing Statements
 - Collection of the fee
 - Advise in English and Spanish that energy assistance is available through 1-800-HEAT-HELP
 - Individuals who collect the energy assistance fund are exempt from the monthly fee; fees can be removed for 12 months
 - Bill must include a number to opt-out of paying the fee
- LOW INCOME ENERGY AND WATER ASSISTANCE COMMISSION
 - Governor appointed
 - 7 members (one consumer; three industry reps)
- WATER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
 - · Water Utility can finance water bills for low income households
 - · Customers can donate to the program
- WEATHERIZATION
 - 40% of funds collected must support weatherization
- 2% of funds must go to community organizations to low income and minority households

HB21-1123 CAPS Check for Substantiated Mistreatment of Adults

- DORA can disclose the CAPS check without a court order for regulatory investigation - access to the license numbers must be provided by employer/employee;
- Licensee, certificate holder, or registrant must submit the license number
- Someone who is petitioning for a guardianship or conservatorship
- Submit a CAPS check prior to appointment as a guardian or conservator; court gets noticed if there is a substantiated case of mistreatment within 7 days
- Notice must be provided of any changes to a health oversight agency;
- Strengthens appeal rights for the accuses
- CDHS shall notify DORA within 10 days of any findings

- Monitor the Board of Human Services agenda for a copy of the rules
- Review the rules
- Consider testifying to the Board

SB21-181 Equity Strategic Plan Address Health Disparities

- Renames the program to Health Disparities and Community Grant Program in the CDPHE Office of Health Equity
- Grants to affect the social determinates of health to reduce disease and reduce health disparities in underrepresented populations in state agencies
- Grants for community organization to reduce health disparities and with a focus on policy and systems changes regarding social determinates of health
- Facilitate a state agency work group that develops an equity strategic plan that identifies priorities, obstacles, goals and timelines to address health disparities in state agency work and influence;
- Community grants that focus on strategic planning, building staff capacity, technical training and assistance and evaluate impact
- Have a state equity plan by 7/1/22

- Health disparities grants available for statewide iniativies
- Contact the Office of Health Disparities at CDPHE to provide stakeholder input
- Serve on the Health Equity Commission

SB21- 118 Alternative Response Mistreatment At-Risk Adults

- Pilot program for 15 counties to provide training and technical assistance
- Alternatives to investigate lowrisk reports vs Full investigation requiring in-person interviews and making a finding;
- Contract with a 3rd party to study effectiveness for 2 years; include in SMART hearings in 2025-26.

Human Services

Sent to the Governor

- Provide input to the Department on risk factors
- Monitor the proposed rules
- Provide testimony to the Human Services Board

SB21-231 - Energy Office Weatherization Assistance Grants

- One time transfer of \$3 million from the general fund to the energy fund administered by the Colorado Energy Office for grants for weatherization assistance.
- 8% Administrative cap for grants

CALL TO ACTION

Let more people know about the funds for furnaces, refrigerators, window repair, etc

SB21-128 Modification to Administration of the Nursing Home Penalty Cash Fund

- Transfers the program from Health Care Policy and Financing to Department of Public Health on 7/1/21.
- Authorizes some expenditures including reimbursing the board for expenses, allows governments to apply for funding, and allows for emergency funding authority
- Requires Health Department to provide notice of a violation to the nursing home 10 days, rather than 5 days.
- Appropriates \$2 million for nursing home grants

SB21-148 Creation of Financial Empowerment Office

 Creates new office in the AG's office on financial empowerment to grow financial resilience and well-being. Director appt by AG. Partner with government, community org, and other organizations to strengthen financial products with banks and other financial areas of interest.
