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EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT



The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides a \$50 per month discount towards broadband service for households that have an income of 135% of the federal poverty guidelines (\$1448/

mo) or participate in programs such as SNAP or Medicaid. Households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from a participating provider if you pay between \$10 and \$50 toward the purchase price.

Households must complete an application, as well as contact a participating provider to select a service plan. Apply online at <a href="mailto:setemptogenequestrial-getemptogen

For a list of broadband providers or help with an application, call 303-333-3482 or 1-855-293-6911 (toll free) or 1-855-880-4777 (Spanish). The program will end 6 months after the COVID-19 pandemic expires.

MEANINGFUL VOLUNTEER WORK



Are you looking for meaningful volunteer opportunity that is safe and that you can do from the comfort of your home. Sign up to become a Telephone Buddy.

The Society needs Telephone Buddies who are volunteers who spend 10 to 15 minutes with an older adult once or twice a week to reduce isolation, loneliness and depression. Volunteers check to make sure their Buddy has food, prescriptions, and other support.

Volunteers report their visits and help to identify the needs of older adults who are often living alone without a support system. Training is provided. Register at www.senioranswers.org or call 303-333-3482.

RESOURCES AND BENEFITS



The <u>Dental Program</u> makes grants to individuals who need dental care including exams, x-rays, fillings, extractions, and full and partial dentures to individuals age 60 and over in metro Denver and

the West Slope south of I-70 and west of I-25.



The <u>Hearing Program</u> makes grants to individuals who need basic inner-ear or over-the-ear hearing aids. Individuals must live in metro Denver and be age 60 and over.

The <u>Vision Program</u> makes grants available for a basic eye exam, selected frames, and basic lenses (single vision or lined bifocal/trifocal) to individuals age 60 and over who live in metro Denver.

The <u>Colorado Low-income</u> <u>Energy Assistance</u>

<u>Program</u> (LEAP) pays some of your winter home heating costs. Households with a gross income of up to \$2,619/mo (singles) or \$3,425/mo (couples) may apply. Applications (<u>English</u> or <u>Spanish</u>) will open November 1.

The PTC rebate provides cash benefits to older adults and disabled residents of Colorado. The cash benefit is a rebate of property tax, rent, and/or heat paid in the previous year. In 2020 older adults who made less than \$1,299/mo (single) or \$1,755 (couple) can apply. You can apply for the 2020 rebate until December 31, 2022 and the 2019 rebate until December 31, 2021.



The Senior Property Tax Homestead Exemption Program is available to home owners who have lived in their home for ten years or more. The Exemption provides a 50% reduction in the

property taxes on the first \$200,000 of value. Apply at your county assessor's office before July 15, 2022 for tax relief on your 2022 taxes which will be paid in 2023.



Payment to the Elderly and Disabled. Only Residents of Denver County age 65 and over or disabled can apply for a property tax, rent or heat rebate (in addition to the PTC 104 rebate).

Income must be less than \$22,750/yr (single) and \$25,010/yr (couple) in 2020. Apply before April 30, 2022.



Colorado Medical Exemption Program (For Xcel customers only) is available to households that use more than 606 kilowatt hours of power per month from June through September for medical reasons.

Income must be less than \$51,520/yr (single) or \$69,680/yr (couple). Applications are due May 1, 2022.

Black Hills Energy Is also participating in the Colorado Medical Exemption Program. The Program is available year around. Individuals must make less than \$2658/mo (couples less than \$3592/mo).
